Jefferson County native Thomas Muir "Tommy" Anderson died in Jefferson Healthcare hospital, Port Townsend, of complications from pneumonia. He was 85.

He was born to Robert Alston and Margaret M. (McConnachie) Anderson in Chimacum and grew up on a farm in Dabob.

He graduated from high school in Chimacum, then studied one year Washington State College.

He played minor league baseball in Salem, Ore., and was coached by former major league pitcher Carl Mays.

After induction into the military, Mr. Anderson operated shovel and crane with the 339th Construction Battalion of the Army Corps of Engineers during World War II.

From July 1942 to December 1945, his duty included liberation of the Philippines, Luzon and Guam.

He was past president of the Veterans of Foreign Wars post in Jefferson County.

He married Kathleen Ellen Hart on June 5, 1949, in Quilcene Presbyterian Church.

Mr. Anderson worked for several Peninsula companies, including Buck Mount in Quilcene, Seton Inc. at Four 4 Corners, and for West End contractors.

Survivors include his wife; son and daughter Robert A. and Kristine Anderson of Lewiston, Idaho; son William C. Anderson of Quilcene; three grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by daughter-in-law Debra Anderson and brother John Anderson.
