

FAIRMONT — Filmore W. Donini, 89, of Fairmont, left this world to join the Lord and his wife in eternity on Jan. 26, 2014.

Filmore served his country during World War II, March 6, 1943 through Dec. 28, 1945. He retired from Arkwright Mine with 43 years of service. He was a lifetime fan of Pittsburgh Pirates' baseball. Filmore was a member of the Immaculate Conception Catholic Church in Fairmont.
