## ROBERT D. NORMAN

Robert D. Norman, age 76, a resident of 822 4th St., Menominee, died Saturday, September 5, 1998 at home. He was born December 5, 1921 in Marinette to Ruben and Ida Norman.

He married Jeanette Beattie and later he married Patricia Willis in 1976. She preceded him in death on October 11, 1996. He was a member of Emmanuel Lutheran Church, the American Legion where he was past commander, the VFW, NARFE (National Association of Retired Federal Employees), and the American Postal Workers Union. Robert worked for the U.S. Postal Service in Menominee for 19 years, retiring in 1985. Prior to that he had worked at FNT Industries in

Menominee and as a young man he logged in Menominee County. He served in the U.S. Army during WWII from August, 1942 thru November, 1945. He served in New Guinea and the southern Philippines as a truck driver and mechanic. He had received the Good Conduct Medal.

He is survived by 1 son, Dan Norman of Menominee; 2 daughters, Kim Norman of Menominee and Linda Norman of Oconto; 5 stepdaughters, Colleen (Jeff) Koehler of Marinette, Rose (Mike) Markey of Lansing, Michigan, Anne Walker of Madison, Wisconsin, Mary (Mike) Wilson of Maple Grove, Minnesota and Paula (Pat) Wilson of Two Rivers, Wisconsin; 2 stepsons, Mike Peregoy of San Francisco, California and Tim (Melanie) Peregoy of Madison, Wisconsin; 26 grandchildren; 1 great-grandchild. He was preceded in death by 1 stepson, Patrick Peregoy and 1 brother, Richard Norman.
